Ataturk Institute of Modern Turkish History Economic and Social History of Turkey since 1820

This course will offer a survey of the economic and social history of Turkey from the early nineteenth century until the present. For each period, developments in Europe and the world will also be examined to some extent in order to provide a comparative perspective.

The emphasis will be on economic development and human development and the role of institutions as a major explanation for both.

For the nineteenth century, two themes are at the center: European economic expansion and the process of Reform before and after Tanzimat.

For the twentieth century or Republican era, three distinct periods are identified: the interwar years, post-WWII expansion and the era of globalization since 1980. In each period, the course will emphasize the interaction between domestic and international forces in the shaping of institutions and the course of economic development. Social change will be examined in connection with the economic.

The basic requirements of the course are:

- i) regular attendance and participation in classroom discussion, (20 percent of the course grade)
- ii) (About eight) short written assignments whose format will be discussed in the first meeting of the course (30 percent).
- iii) Final examination at the end of the term (50 percent).

Required readings for the course are indicated below with an (*). All other materials are recommended but optional.

Students are expected to do each week's reading $\underline{\text{before}}$ class.
